

AGH BMO World Film Festival Opens this Friday with Loving Vincent and Long Time Running

October 11, 2017, Hamilton ON – The AGH BMO World Film Festival, the Art Gallery of Hamilton's annual film festival now in its 9th year, brings 54 films to five unique venues across Hamilton from Friday, October 13 to Sunday, October 22.

Representing 25 countries,18 languages and a spectrum of engaging topics, the Festival opens at the Lincoln Alexander Centre with a sold out 7 pm screening of *Loving Vincent*, the world's first fully painted film. Created using 100 painters and 65,000 frames, *Loving Vincent*, was a labour-intensive project that took four years to develop and then two more years of painting to complete. A second screening of *Loving Vincent* has now been added on Friday, October 20 at 7:30 pm to meet public demand.

Opening Night will also feature a 9:30 pm screening of *Long Time Running*, a powerful documentary profiling the 2016 final tour of Canadian rock icons The Tragically Hip. It is also bound to be a festival favourite

Other new Festival highlights include a free screening of the AGH Youth Film Challenge presented by the Hamilton Community Foundation on Saturday, October 14 at 12 pm and the winner of a 24-Hour Film Race to screen on Saturday, October 21 at 8 pm. Presented by Banko Media and Collective Arts Brewing, the race challenges Hamilton filmmakers to create the best short film in only 24 hours.

"The festival continues to become more dynamic and welcome larger audiences each year," says Ryan Ferguson, AGH BMO World Film Festival Curator. "More and more people in this area are seeking out thought-provoking, high-quality films as an alternative to mainstream cinema; it's really exciting."

Festival audiences will have opportunities throughout the ten day event to join discussions with directors and special guests such as Mayor Fred Eisenberger, (Part of a panel following the screening of *Citizen Jane: Battle for the City* on Saturday, October 14 at 4 pm). There will also be a great kick-off party, this year inspired by Stanly Kurbrick's classic thriller *The Shining*. Within the glamour of the Lincoln Alexander Centre, guests will enjoy "Red Rum" cocktails as they mingle with ghosts from the 1920s and groove to tunes by DJ Better Love. Free entry, everyone welcome.
