

AGH COLLECTION & CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS (K to 12) – Virtual Mini-Tour and Worksheets

- **Talking About Art: People and Stories** With a focus on visual literacy, students will look for clues in three paintings to uncover the story the artist is telling. (language inferencing)
- Art & Math: 2D, 3D, Organic and Geometric Shapes Using abstract and representational art, students will discover the world of shapes, identifying shared characteristics and techniques.
- Art & Society: Disrupting Gaze in Modern Art By pairing a virtual tour of the exhibition Early Snow with a performance by Hamilton's (F)NOR collective, senior students will be encouraged to reconsider ideas of representation and the need to add today's context to historical artworks.
