

AGH COLLECTION & CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS (K to 12) – Virtual Mini-Tour and Worksheets

- **Talking About Art: Perspectives on Industry** – By comparing two works of art separated by nearly 100 years, we use art to explore changing attitudes about landscape and industry.
- **Art & Math: Fractions** – We will use three abstract paintings to explore the idea of equal parts and fractions, then we'll look at the ways artists use the same ideas in their landscapes.
- **Art & Society: Looking at the Land – Three perspectives** – Tom Thomson and Emily Carr are known for the way they present their versions of nationalism or conservation through the Canadian landscape. But neither tell the full story. By adding a work by Robert Houle we explore missing or excluded presence.

- **Tyler Makes: DIY Watercolours** – If you've been caught at home with limited art materials, it is time to make your own. Using the paint you've made, try some quick landscape paintings.
