Jan Wade: Soul Power

For over thirty years, Jan Wade has been creating mixed-media paintings, textiles, and sculptural objects, drawing upon her lived experience as an African Canadian person and her mixed cultural heritage. *Jan Wade: Soul Power* brings together the artist's diverse body of work alongside new pieces made specifically for the exhibition.

Radha S. Menon: Touched by Devi

Touched by Devi is a multi-media project and is the first major solo museum exhibition for Hamilton-based artist and playwright Radha S. Menon. This exhibition responds to the complex histories of women in colonized India, expressed through portrait photography, interview text, movement, and sculptural installation. These elements come together as part of an ongoing healing journey for the artist, as she explores the history of women's rights in India in connection with her family history.
