

# The Art Gallery of Hamilton wins in three categories for best exhibition, publication, and curatorial writing

Galeries Ontario / Ontario Galleries (GOG) recognizes the AGH for the exhibition *Shelley Niro: 500 Year Itch* and its accompanying publication

The Art Gallery of Hamilton was recognized for excellence in three categories at the 47<sup>th</sup> Annual GOG Awards ceremony, which was held at the Harbourfront Centre in Toronto on December 3, 2024. The GOG Awards were created to highlight the continued excellence, innovation, and importance of public art galleries, art museums, art centres, and art organizations. This year, 23 art galleries from 18 cities throughout the province submitted 125 nominations for awards consideration. As the only annual juried awards of its kind, the iconic GOG Awards celebrate the outstanding achievement, artistic merit, and excellence of arts institutions and professionals in the public art gallery sector.

Spanning four decades of Shelley Niro's photography, film, painting, installation, beadwork, sculpture, and mixed media practice, *Shelley Niro: 500 Year Itch* is a compelling exhibition that highlights themes she constantly returns to: Matriarchy, Past is Present, Actors, and Family Relations. She uses parody, feminism, and spirituality to examine identity, and in turn, brings political power to the realm of the personal.

Seven years in the making, **Shelley Niro: 500 Year Itch** was organized and circulated by the Art Gallery of Hamilton with the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian, with curatorial support from the National Gallery of Canada.

The touring exhibition, which is currently on show at the Vancouver Art Gallery until February 17, 2025, also had stops at the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Indian in New York City, the Art Gallery of Hamilton, and the National Gallery of Canada in Ottawa. The exhibition's next stop will be Remai Modern in Saskatoon, where it will run from April 4 to August 31, 2025.
